

TURN YOUR HEART TOWARD HEAVEN

Rev. 14:1-5

As a child of God, you can survive the trials of this life by emphasizing the unique qualities of your relationship with Jesus:

1. YOUR PLACE

"Then I looked, and behold, on Mount Zion stood the Lamb..." Rev. 14:1a

...Jesus is preparing a PLACE in HEAVEN with HIM for you!

2. YOUR PROTECTION

"...and with him 144,000 who had his name and his Father's name written on their foreheads." Rev. 14:1b

...Jesus will never LOSE you!

3. YOUR PRAISE

"And I heard a voice from heaven like the roar of many waters and like the sound of loud thunder. The voice I heard was like the sound of harpists playing on their harps, and they were singing a new song before the throne and before the four living creatures and before the elders." Rev. 14:2-3a

...PRAISING God is the expression of FAITH that your TRIALS will be conquered.

4. YOUR PURPOSE

"No one could learn that song except the 144,000 who had been redeemed from the earth." Rev. 14:3b

...Your ENJOYMENT of heaven depends on you FULFILLING your unique PURPOSE.

5. YOUR PURITY

"It is these who have not defiled themselves with women, for they are virgins." Rev. 14:4a

...Maintaining your SEXUAL PURITY will help keep you in God's WILL now, and will enhance your JOY in heaven later.

6. YOUR PRACTICE

"It is these who follow the Lamb wherever he goes.." Rev. 14:4b

...If you follow JESUS through this life, you will be His
COMPANION in HEAVEN.

7. YOUR POSITION

"These have been redeemed from mankind as firstfruits for God and the Lamb..." Rev. 14:4c

...You were saved to TELL OTHERS about JESUS.

8. YOUR PERSISTENCE

"...and in their mouth no lie was found..." Rev. 14:5a

...You must LIVE the TRUTH to avoid the LIES of SATAN.

9. YOUR PARDON

"...for they are blameless." Rev. 14:5b

...Jesus CLEANSSES you so that you can STAND
BLAMELESS in God's PRESENCE.
